

Follow up: Centreville Public School

Positive COVID-19 Case in School

April 1, 2021

Dear Families,

This letter is a follow up to the case you were notified about on Tuesday, March 30, 2021. The purpose of this letter is to inform you that KFL&A Public Health's investigation has shown no further risk to the larger school population.

Everyone in the Grade 1/2 class and their household members, as well as staff who have been identified as high-risk contacts and their household members, must continue to isolate, and follow the direction of KFL&A Public Health.

If your student is **not** in the Grade 1/2 class and is **not** a sibling of someone in the Grade 1/2 class, your student no longer needs to self-isolate. **Centreville PS will reopen and your student may return to school on Tuesday, April 6, 2021.**

What should you do?

- Continue to monitor for symptoms of COVID-19 and screen your student daily as most cases of COVID-19 are acquired in the home setting.
- If anyone in your household has or develops symptoms of COVID-19, they must self-isolate and should book an appointment at an assessment centre for testing as soon as possible. It is required that all household members isolate until the person with symptoms receives a negative COVID-19 test result or an alternative diagnosis from a health care professional.
- If you have been contacted directly by KFL&A Public Health, please continue to follow the directions provided.

Thank you for your patience as we investigate cases to minimize risk to the school community.
